They came to us having served since 2002 in Haiti, with Global Outreach International. Before that, they also worked with Children's International Lifeline in Haiti.

The Kendalls helped MOWA Center in establishing a successful food bank program that provides food for families in need. Last year, 125 families received food. In four months time, the Center gives out 3200 lbs of food.

Ann and Tim were also pivotal in distributing Christmas boxes for 57 families; giving 97 children gifts for Christmas last year.

A community Block Party in May, complete with bounce houses, gave NCYM and the Sanktown community an opportunity to say thank you to the family.

Of course, a wonderful bonus that came with the Kendalls were their six children: Katherine, Christopher, Dwight, Jonathan, Krislena, and Karl.

The Kendall family will be remembered and appreciated for their faithful witness in the Sanktown community.
